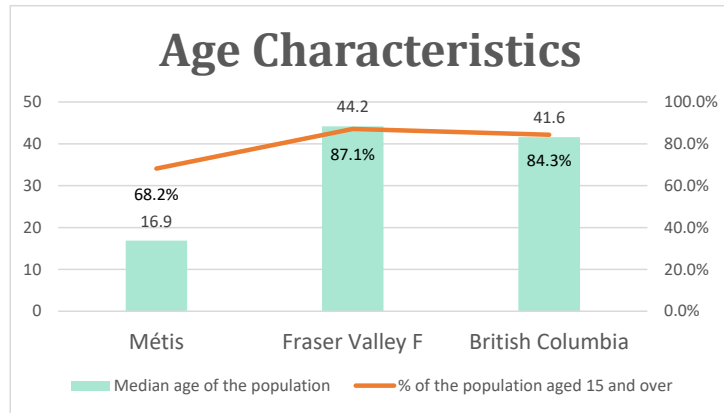

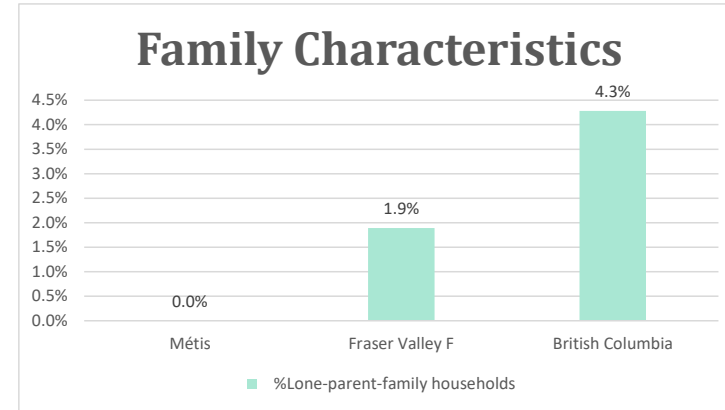

The total population reported with Métis single identity is 330 (Total Métis household is 70), representing 97% of Aboriginal people, accounting for 25.0% of the total population in Fraser Valley F.



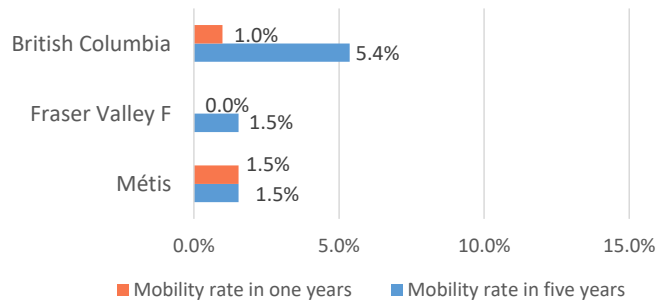
For Métis single identity population, the median age is 16.9 years old, with 68.2% of the population aged 15 and over. As for the total population, the median age is 44.2 in Fraser Valley F and

41.6 years old in British Columbia, with 87.1% and 84.3% population aged 15 and over respectively.



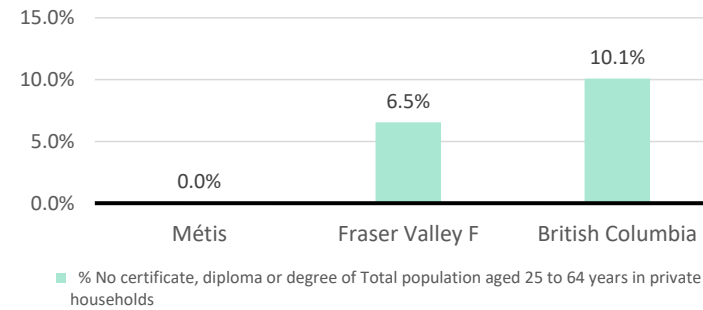
No Métis single lone parents household reported to the survey.

## Education



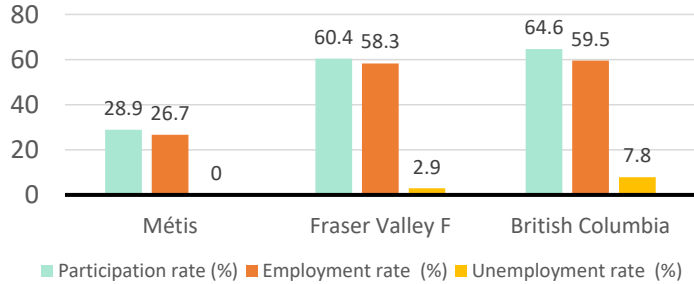
For population aged from 25 to 64 years, no Métis reported have no certificate, diploma or degree.

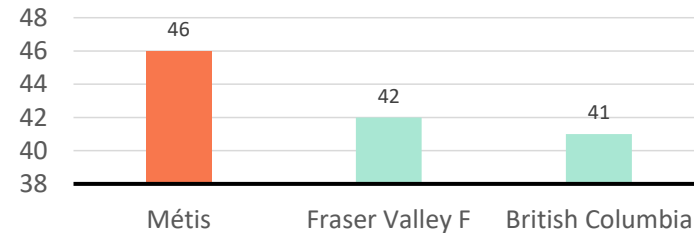
### Labour Force Status



Métis participation rate is 28.9%, employment rate is 26.7%, and unemployment rate is 0.0%.

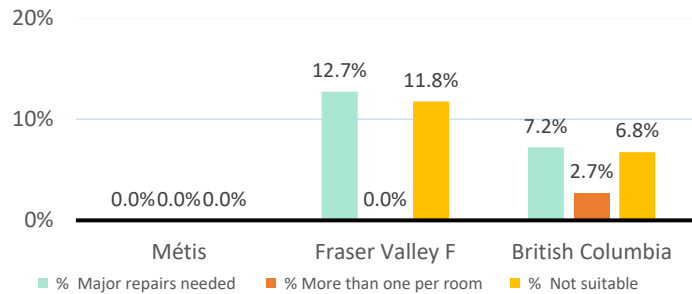
While the participation rate is lower compared with total population in Fraser Valley F and British Columbia (60.4% and 64.6%), no Métis reported unemployment.

### Average Weeks Worked in 2010



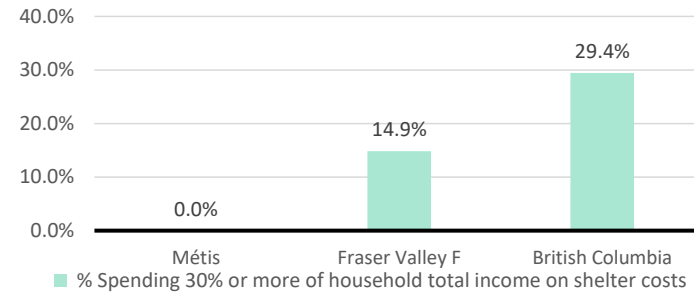
The average weeks worked in 2010 is 46.0 weeks.

### Shelter Costs



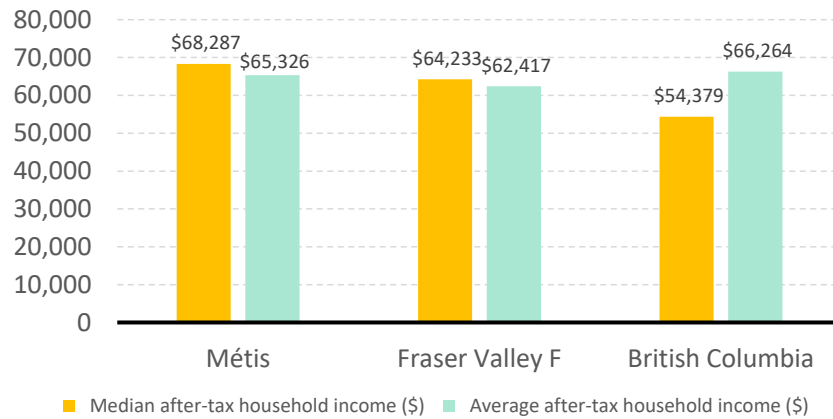
No Métis households reported spending 30% or more of household total income on shelter costs,

## Income

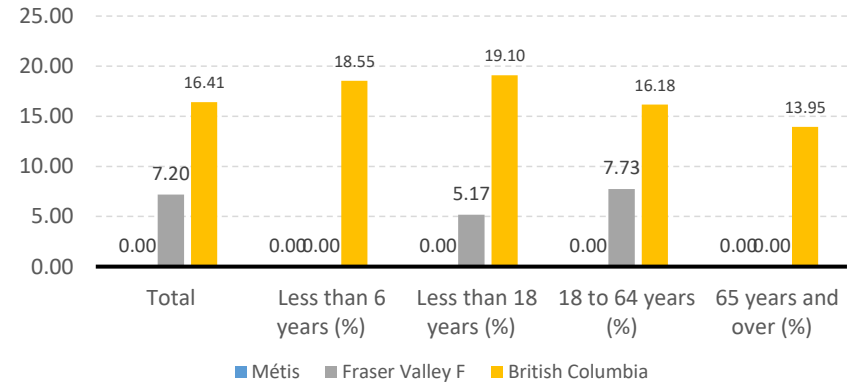
After-Tax Income of Households in 2010



For Métis singles, median after-tax household income is \$68,287, and average after-tax household income is

\$65,326. Métis has higher median and average after-tax income than Fraser Valley F, and higher median and lower average after-tax income than British Columbia.
