




For Métis single identity population, the median age is 26.9 years old, with 78.3% of the population aged 15 and over. As for the total population, the median age is 40.3 in Kingston and




15 Métis households moved in last year (1.6%), 70 Métis households moved in the past 5 years (8.0%).

Education






Labor Force & Housing Statistics



Métis participation rate is 71.8%, employment rate is 65.1%, and unemployment rate is 8.4%.


While the participation rate is higher compared with total population in Kingston and Ontario (64.4% and 65.5%), unemployment rate is around the same.

Household Characteristics






After-Tax Income of Households in 2010

For Métis singles, median after-tax household income is \$56,047, and average after-tax household income is \$66,199. Métis has higher median and average after-tax income than Kingston, and lower median and average after-tax income than Ontario.

The prevalence of low income based on after-tax low-income measure is 21.69%.
